Senior- Chocolate Ripple Cake

JA Rock Cakes

5 - 10 yrs

JB Tea Cake

11 - 14 yrs

JC Crunchy Topped Lemon Loaf

15 – 18 yrs

Chocolate Ripple Cake

INGREDIENTS:

125g butter

$\frac{3}{4}$ cup sugar

2 eggs

1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups self-rising flour

$\frac{2}{3}$ cup

Ripple mixture:

1 tablespoon cocoa

$\frac{1}{4}$ cup caster sugar

$\frac{1}{3}$ cup chopped walnuts

$\frac{1}{2}$ tablespoon butter

Method:

Cooking Method:

Baking

Cream the butter and sugar, add the eggs and beat well after each addition.

Sift the flour and add it alternately with the milk.

Spoon half of the cake mixture into a deep 20cm ring pan.

Combine the ripple mixture ingredients and then sprinkle over the cake mixture in the tin.

Spoon the remaining half of the cake mixture on top.

Bake in moderate oven for 35 minutes or until cooked through.

Rock Cakes

INGREDIENTS:

125g softened butter

2 cups self-raising flour sifted

$\frac{1}{2}$ cup caster sugar

$\frac{3}{4}$ cup dried fruit

1 egg lightly beaten

4 tablespoons milk

Sugar for sprinkling

Method:

Preheat oven to 180c

Lightly grease a baking tray

Rub butter into flour. Mix in the sugar and dried fruit.

Add the egg and milk to the mix to form a firm dough.

Drop heaped spoonfuls onto the tray.

Sprinkle with sugar.

Cook for 10-15 minutes or until golden.

Tea Cake

INGREDIENTS:

60g unsalted butter
¾ cup caster sugar
1 egg
1 ½ cups SR flour
¾ cup milk

Topping:

2 teaspoons butter
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1 teaspoon caster sugar

Method:

Preheat oven to 180c. Grease and line a 20cm round pan with baking paper.

Cream the butter and sugar together using an electric mixer.

Add the egg and beat well.

Sift the flour and add half to the mixing bowl with half of the milk and beat on a low speed until combined, repeat with remaining flour and milk, beat until smooth.

Pour the mixture into the prepared pan and bake for approximately 20-25 minutes or until a skewer comes out clean.

While cake is still warm, smear butter over top, sprinkle with the cinnamon and castor sugar.

Allow to cool.

Crunchy Topped Lemon Loaf

Suggested loaf tin sizes – 9cm x 20cm, 9cm x 22cm, 11cm x 18cm, 12cm x 22cm.

Pre-heat oven to 180c.

Lightly grease a medium sized loaf tin and line bottom with a rectangle of baking paper.

INGREDIENTS:

115g butter
150g caster sugar
2 teaspoons lemon zest
2 eggs
180g flour
1 teaspoon baking powder
110 ml milk

Bring the butter and eggs to room temperature.

Sift flour and baking powder together.

Cream the butter and the sugar until light and fluffy.

Beat in the lemon zest, then the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition.

Use a metal spoon to gently fold in the dry ingredients in about three lots alternating with the milk.

Pour the mixture into prepared tin, smooth the top and bake for about 40 minutes.

The cake will be a beautiful golden colour with a crack running along the top and should be just pulling away from the sides of the tin.

Remove from the oven and place on a cooling rack.

For the topping:

70g caster sugar
2 tablespoons lemon juice

Method:

Combine sugar and lemon juice in a small bowl, then spoon the mixture over the top of the still hot cake. It will soak in a little and run down the sides, leaving a thin crust of sugar on the top.

Finish cooling in the tin, then turn out carefully.
